## **Our Story**

From April 15-21, 2018, our group of 14 high school students and 3 chaperones from St. Theresa of Avila Parish traveled to the Archdiocese of New Orleans and participated in work projects to restore homes of those who have suffered from major flooding and hurricanes in Louisiana. We stayed in the town of Bogalusa and traveled to worksites in both Franklin and Angie, LA daily. From Monday to Thursday, we would wake up, attend daily Mass, work at our worksites, come home in the late afternoon to rest and clean-up, have dinner (usually a Louisiana favorite) provided by the local Knights of Columbus and then have community time in the evening full of games, talks, small group time and prayer. We worked hard during the day tearing up rugs, painting, joint compounding, caulking, sanding, replacing cabinet handles, replacing floor boards, etc. Through the service, the people we met and the faith that we shared, our group had an amazing time, full of many life-changing experiences.
